- Identify numbers using different representations
- Find 10 or 100 more than a given number - recognise place value in 3 digit numbers
- Compare and order numbers up to 1000. Write numbers in numerals and words
- Add and subtract mentally (3 digit numbers)
- Add and subtract 3 digit numbers using column addition/subtraction
- Recall multiplication and division facts for 3,4 and 8 times tables
- Measure, compare, add and subtract lengths
- Measure perimeter of 2D shapes
